You must complete and submit the FAFSA to apply for federal student aid for college or career school and for most state and institutional aid.

Financial aid offices use the information from the FAFSA to determine if you are eligible to receive federal student aid from grants, loans or work-study programs. States and schools also use the information from the FAFSA to determine if you qualify for additional aid. **SO BE SURE TO FILL OUT A FAFSA EVEN IF YOU THINK YOU WON'T QUALIFY FOR FEDERAL AID.**

USEFUL TIPS:

- The QUICKEST way is to APPLY ONLINE using FAFSA on the web at www.fafsa.ed.gov
- A FEDERAL STUDENT AID PIN allows you to sign your FAFSA electronically. Even if you don't file online, a PIN is useful because it can be used to access and to correct your processed FAFSA information later.
 - Apply for your PIN at www.pin.ed.gov
 - If you are providing parent information on the FAFSA, one of your parents must also sign your application. To sign electronically, your parent should apply for his or her own PIN.
- GATHER THE INFORMATION REQUIRED TO APPLY
 - Social Security number
 - Yours
 - Your parents' if you are providing parent information
 - Driver's license number if you have one
 - Alien Registration Number if you are not a U.S. Citizen
 - Federal tax information or tax returns, including W-2 information, using income records for the year prior to the academic year for which you are applying
 - For yourself
 - Spouse if married
 - Parents if you are providing parent information,
 - Records of untaxed income, such as Social Security benefits, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), and veterans benefits, for yourself (and for your parents if you are providing parents information); and information on savings, investments, and business and farm assets for yourself (and for your parents if you are providing parent information).
- Be Aware of DEADLINES- You may have to meet application deadlines, depending on your college and where you live. State and school deadlines are usually earlier than federal deadlines.
- The FAFSA on the web WORKSHEET- This worksheet is optional but can be useful if you decide to file your FAFSA online. Your college or high school might have a copy of the worksheet, or you can print one from www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- Follow up on your FAFSA- Your application will be processed and you will receive your STUDENT AID REPORT by e-mail or by mail. You should review your SAR for any necessary corrections or updates. If you do not hear from them within three weeks, go to www.fafsa.ed.gov and select "Check the Status of a Submitted FAFSA," or you may call 1-800-4-FED-AID.

Types of Financial Aid

Federal Pell Grant- A federally funded grant available to undergraduates. It is income based. In order to receive a person needs to complete the FAFSA for the appropriate academic year

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)- A grant issued to undergraduates with exceptional financial need. The priority is given to Federal Pell Grant recipients and the funds depend on availability at the school. The application needed for this grants is the FAFSA.

Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG)- For undergraduates receiving Pell Grants who are U.S. citizens enrolled full-time in their first or second academic year of study. First academic year students must have completed a rigorous secondary school program of study, graduated from high school after Jan. 1, 2006 and have not been previously enrolled in an undergraduate program. Second academic year students must have completed a rigorous secondary school program of study, graduated from high school after Jan. 1 2005, and have a 3.0 cumulative GPA at the completion of their first year of postsecondary study. This grant is applied for via the FAFSA

National Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grant (National SMART Grant)-For undergraduates receiving the Federal Pell Grant, who are U.S. citizens enrolled full-time in their third or fourth academic year of an eligible degree program majoring in physical, life, or computer sciences, engineering, technology, mathematics or a critical-need foreign language and have at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA. This grant is applied for via the FAFSA.
