

Cherokee Nation Education Services is submitting an application to the US Department of Health and Human Services for funding through the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) for Fiscal Year 2019.

The Goals and Objectives of the Cherokee Nation plan are described below:

Goal: Provide a fifty hour summer high school readiness program for low-income middle school age students.

Objectives:

1. The project will serve a minimum of 300 students (30 at each site) and a maximum of 600 (60 at each site) students at 10 school sites.
2. The schools that report the highest percentage of students that qualify for free and/or reduced lunches will be given first consideration as a site.
3. A maximum of 40 certified teachers will be trained in the Strategies for Success curriculum. The teacher student ratio will be one teacher per 15 students with a maximum of 4 teachers per site.
4. A final report will be submitted by each site that tells the number of enrolled students, number that completed the program, description of the service-learning project, and success story or stories.
5. Site visits will be conducted by grant staff to monitor usage of curriculum at each school site.

Goal: Provide a 5-day financial literacy program for low income middle school age students that will help them learn how to use money responsibly.

Objectives:

1. The program will serve a minimum of 240 (20 at each site) students and a maximum of 480 (40 at each site) students at 12 different school sites. There will be 2 teachers per site.
2. A maximum of 24 certified teachers will be trained in the Camp Millionaire curriculum.
3. Site visits will be conducted by grant staff to monitor funded sites. A report of the progress of each site will be given to the Manager of College Resources.

The plan in its entirety will be available for review in the College Resources Department. The Cherokee Nation invites citizens and other interested parties to review and comment on the 2019 CSBG plan. Comments can be sent via one of these methods by Monday, August 13, 2018 by 5pm.
