Cherokee Nation stole program

The stole program is available for college students who are Cherokee Nation citizens. The program offers the opportunity to receive graduation stoles for one Associate (Art, Science or Applied Science - Nursing), Bachelors, Masters or Doctoral degree. Under this program, citizens will receive one graduation stole per degree level. Students graduating from high school, vocational program or propriety schools are not eligible. PREPARING FOR COLLEGE: CHECKLIST FOR H.S. SENIORS

- File for Free Applications for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa
 Seven items needed before filling out the FAFSA:
 - FSA ID
 - Social security number
 - Drivers license number
 - 2018 tax records
 - · Record of untaxed income
 - Records of assets (money)
 - List of schools interested in attending
- Research scholarships. Utilize school counselor for scholarship information.
- Register for the ACT and/or SAT.
- Look at college applications. Make note of required information needed to complete the applications.
- Create a checklist or calendar to keep track of standardized test dates, college application due dates and financial aid deadlines. Make note of the other materials required, such as recommendations or essays.
- Don't slack on schoolwork. Colleges will require high school transcripts.
- Finalize college essays. Many schools require at least one essay with application.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

As part of our ongoing effort to minimize exposure and educate students, we are offering an alternative to the community service hours required for the Spring 2020 semester. Scholarship students can substitute community service by watching several video resources from the CDC related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

How to protect yourself and others from COVID-19:

- Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean hands regularly with an alcohol-based sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces often.
- Avoid crowded areas when going out and avoid close contact with others.
- Stay at least 6 feet from other people.
- Do not gather in groups.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.
- Cover coughs and sneezes.
